### **WHO WE ARE**

Culture Perth & Kinross is a charitable trust which works to be at the heart of a community that connects people with culture, heritage, stories, ideas, knowledge, and collections. Working with our communities we deliver a range of innovative and creative cultural services, public programmes, and partnerships which engage a wide and diverse audience.

Based in the heart of Scotland we care for a Recognised Collection of National Significance and deliver a programme of cultural experiences which enrich lives through heritage and the arts. The flagship of this will be the £27.5M Perth Museum project, a major new visitor attraction telling the story of Perth's place in shaping the early Scottish nation and the roots of modern Scotland.

The area around Perth is the cradle of Scotland. This was the place where ancient power coalesced into the Kingdom of Alba and where the idea of Scotlish nationhood was born. Seat of Parliaments and Kings, it is the key to understanding Scotland's history and identity.

At the centre of the new museum will be The Stone of Destiny, also known as the Stone of Scone, one of the UK's and Scotland's most important cultural objects, which will be relocated from Edinburgh Castle back to its original home in Perthshire.

The Stone is a symbol of Scotland from its earliest days as a nation and remains significant to the UK as a whole; continuing to play a critical role in the coronation of British monarchs.

It will be the centrepiece of the museum's displays, and much of our work will focus on providing the right, free to access environment for people to see it, understand its relevance, and explore its importance.

### WHAT MUSEUMS DO

Museums are transformational, through active public participation, engaging with diverse communities, and sharing collections they have the power to change lives. They can meet people where they are and inspire and challenge them. They can engender a sense of belonging, even from a young age.

Through museum collections we can learn about ourselves – our identity and our history. Museums help us look back, and at the same time look forward. This creates the conditions for a healthy civic society.

Museums can have an impact on well-being, education, social change, health, sustainability, and community. With society facing issues such as poverty, inequality, intolerance and discrimination, museums can help us understand, debate, and challenge these concerns.

The stories Perth Museum will tell about Scotland, and the region are rooted in the collections and enhanced with the presence of the Stone of Destiny.

In 2005 Māori ancestral remains were repatriated to the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa. We engaged with Māori communities to lead on the conservation, storytelling and interpretation of the Māori collection, including the internationally significant kākāpō feather cloak.
